

1. Please could you describe the intelligence handling and analysis processes used by your force. For clarity, we are particularly interested in processes that relate to the definition, collection, use, retention and disclosure of intelligence, including the criteria for uploading onto the PND and specialised databases.

**Intelligence is collected, managed, used and analysed in line with the National Intelligence Model. (Manuals are available on line) (Please see below links)**

**Intelligence handling utilises the 5x5x5 process. Once received Intelligence is sanitised to remove any information that could trace it back to the source and combined with other information and data to assist policing to understand the threat, risk and opportunity presented by the intelligence to meet the force vision.**

**Retention of intelligence is in line with MOPI (manuals are available on line) (Please see below links)**

**Disclosure of intelligence is in line with the disclosure legislation for policing (Manuals are available on line) and the 5x5x5 intelligence handling codes (explanation available online)**

**All intelligence gets uploaded to PND. There is a single intelligence database where intelligence logs are stored and this is searchable through a data warehouse function.**
