We have approached various units in order to get a definitive figure and please note that the following may not be an exhaustive list. Our recorded information shows that there are currently 20 in police vehicles and 12 at static premises at sites

- 2. How many times have they been used.**

They have been used 11 times, however this may not be a true reflective figure and is based on recorded information held, as above.

- 3. How many times has their use resulted in a life being saved.**

Two occasions, however as above, this may not be a true reflective figure and is based on recorded information held

- 4. How many times has the equipment not been useable due to a technical failure or lack of battery supplies.**

There has been two occasions when the devices have been taken offline due to technical issues. On both occasions they were replaced so that the car continued to carry an AED.

Batteries and pads replacement are part of a rolling "bring forward" program to ensure they are changed before the due date
