

**I am examining the issue of disruptive and drunken aircraft passengers.**

**Police forces in the UK including yours responded to a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 made in March 2016 by the Press Association.**

**We would like to make the following request for updated information under the Freedom of Information Act:**

**For the period from 1 March 2016 to 28 February 2017, please provide the following information:**

**a) The number of people arrested by your police force on suspicion of being drunk (or drunk and disorderly) on an aircraft.**

from 1 March 2016 to 28 February 2017

6 - Being drunk on an aircraft  
1-Entering an aircraft when drunk

Where the location is Birmingham Airport

**b) A separate breakdown of the number of people arrested by your police force on suspicion of being drunk (or drunk and disorderly) in an airport.**

12 Drunk and disorderly in a public place.

**c) If there were any other arrests in the same period in relation to other drink-related incidents at airports and on aircraft for offences not specified above, please also supply separate figures for these arrests. Please only supply this further information if it is practicable and if it would not cause substantial delay to your answers to (a) and (b).**

**31 Offences other than those specified above, where the location is Birmingham Airport .**

*Offences other than those specified above for the total number of people arrested at the airport where the offender has an alcohol marker. However, this might not necessarily mean that alcohol was a contributing factor, merely that the offender had consumed alcohol. .*
