

Circumstances of arrest for airport

1.

Officers were called to [REDACTED] A plane due to take off to [REDACTED] A passenger, this PIC, had been prevented from boarding due to [REDACTED] drunken behaviour. PIC was intoxicated. Breath smelt of alcohol. PIC was disorderly and argumentative. PIC was ranting making abusive comments. Officers escorted the PIC away with intention to have [REDACTED] leave the airport. At baggage reclaim, PIC continued arguing and shouting in drunken disorderly manner. PIC informed if [REDACTED] was calm, quiet and orderly, [REDACTED] could wait for [REDACTED] bags and leave. PIC continued to be abusive, repeating several times, [REDACTED] PIC arrested for being drunk and disorderly. PIC started to resist, trying to pull away. As being walked away, PIC resisting, made as to back kick [REDACTED] PIC taken to ground. Restrained and controlled. Alternatives to arrest considered but given busy airport, members of the public looking on.

2.

[REDACTED] report of [REDACTED] guests fighting amongst themselves in the lobby. On arrival, [REDACTED] leaving their companion, this PIC behind. This PIC being detained in a corner by PIC was under influence of drink and possibly drugs [REDACTED] PIC was screaming hysterically whilst also visibly upset. Verbally and physically aggressive to staff and police officers. Incoherent. PIC was set on leaving the location. PIC making threats [REDACTED] PIC was arrested drunk and disorderly [REDACTED]

3.

[REDACTED] called to [REDACTED] report of drunken [REDACTED] On arrival PIC was sitting down and not responding to speech. PIC then became abusive to Officers and [REDACTED] started shouting & swearing at other passengers and all attempts to calm [REDACTED] failed. PIC was unsteady on [REDACTED] feet and for [REDACTED] own & others safety Officers had no option but to arrest the PIC for being drunk & disorderly. No alternative but to arrest

4.

[REDACTED] assistance of police to this PIC, being a drunken [REDACTED] being disorderly in the airport terminal. Officers attended and encountered the PIC just outside exit [REDACTED] PIC was intoxicated. Smelt of alcohol. Unsteady on [REDACTED] feet. Speech slurred. The PIC was disorderly in repeatedly loudly, in the presence of passers-by [REDACTED] Officers formed opinion that PIC was drunk and disorderly. Alternatives to arrest were considered, but as the PIC was alone and un-attended, it was neither safe nor proper to maintaining peace and good order, to leave the PIC, so was arrested to remove from the scene and to process through custody. Paperwork found in the PICs possession suggests [REDACTED]

5. officers called to [REDACTED] to assist staff with a [REDACTED] who had fallen over on [REDACTED] way to board a flight...officers spoke to [REDACTED] who was clearly very intoxicated and was verbally aggressive to staff ...pic had been refused to fly due to [REDACTED] intoxication ...officers have tried to assist and escorted [REDACTED] out of the airport to get [REDACTED], pic has continued with [REDACTED] drunken behaviour causing problems to staff and public so arrested under airport by-law for being drunk on their premises

6. At [REDACTED] today police called to the [REDACTED] by staff reporting a drunk and abusive customer. On arrival the PIC was identified [REDACTED] was being loud and aggressive towards the staff and on arrival of officers was [REDACTED] On [REDACTED] speaking to [REDACTED] officers formed the opinion [REDACTED] was drunk, speech was slurred very unsteady on [REDACTED] feet and smelt heavily of alcohol. Removed to a side room out of public view where officers tried to establish if fit to [REDACTED] established not fit to fly and told he needed to leave airport, [REDACTED] continued to be aggressive and making threats and [REDACTED] to leave and wanted to fly. Arrested for being drunk in an airport.

7. AO states officers called to meet [REDACTED] which had had to due [REDACTED] to a drunken passenger. Officers attended the aircraft where staff identified the PIC as the drunken [REDACTED] PIC was escorted to [REDACTED] once there [REDACTED] became abusive to officers and attempted to kick [REDACTED] a number of times. Officers were of the opinion PIC was heavily intoxicated and was arrested for D&D. Upon arrest PIC has struggled and become aggressive and abusive

8. Officers called to [REDACTED] where a passenger was told [REDACTED] too drunk to fly as [REDACTED] intoxicated pic fell down and then began swinging out at staff - Pic ws given ample opportunity to calm down and go home but continued to be abusive and would not leave and was abusive to staff and [REDACTED] - pic arrested.

9. pic has been drunk and disorderly at [REDACTED] and despite warnings to leave or go and sleep it off, [REDACTED] has been abusive and offensive to staff. Arrested

10. Officers called to [REDACTED] who stated that an intoxicated [REDACTED] was acting in a disorderly manner shouting and swearing also trying to [REDACTED] On officers arrival PIC smelt strongly of intoxicating liquor and was unsteady on feet. Officers tried to establish an address for PIC but unable and [REDACTED] became increasingly more agitated and disorderly swearing and shouting. Arrested as was clearly upsetting other passengers including families

1.1. Officers called to the [REDACTED] to reports of a disruptive [REDACTED]. On arrival PIC had been detained by search staff and relayed to officers that upon being searched [REDACTED]. At which point [REDACTED] was unsteady on [REDACTED]. Staff have tried to [REDACTED] and being drunk and disorderly. [REDACTED] feet had glazed eyes and slurred speech and smelt strongly of alcohol. Arrested for [REDACTED].

12. Circs from [REDACTED] Airport, information received that there were [REDACTED] believed to be drunk in the same departures terminal at the airport, along with other Officers, made way to [REDACTED]. Officer took PIC to one side to find out what was going on, on first viewing PIC [REDACTED] was unsteady on [REDACTED] feet, smelt heavily of intoxicating liquor, Officer asked if [REDACTED] could see PICs passport, [REDACTED] took out loose coins and dropped them on the floor, [REDACTED].

13 and 14. At [REDACTED] passenger who had been prevented from flying. Upon police arrival the [REDACTED] presented aggressive verbal behaviour and resisted officer instructions. [REDACTED] admitted to drinking alcohol throughout the day. PIC used slurred words, extremely emotional, shouting and swearing. When escorted by officers away from the terminal the pic has resisted presenting a physical danger to self, officers and public [REDACTED].

13 and 14. (Cont) - said that he would look after Pic and take him home. - officers then began to walk them through to [REDACTED] was disruptive and obstructive with search by doing bag back up but during this [REDACTED] was abusive and began [REDACTED] - pic intoxicated and arrested handcuffed to rear [REDACTED] attempted to get hands out and [REDACTED] then became passive resistant and had to be forced to walk forward and on the journey to [REDACTED] physically threatened officers and asked officers to take [REDACTED].

15. No details recorded under aviation offence

16 A/o [redacted] report from airport [redacted] that the pic was drunk and lying outside on benches outside the main terminal and approached the pic, could see that [redacted] was very drunk, asked [redacted] to explain why at the airport, became uncompliant, disruptive and asked to move on, [redacted] became unresponsive to commands, [redacted] was warned several times if [redacted] continued with [redacted] actions, [redacted] would be arrested, [redacted] refused to leave, non-compliant and refusing details, drunk, arrested re drunk and disorderly. There is a by law that public MUST supply details. PIC to be charge for D and D

17 Officer states in the [redacted] of the PIC officers on patrol have seen the PIC walking towards the departures terminal at [redacted] Airport [redacted] was unsteady on feet and stopped to be [redacted] Officers have approached the PIC who had slurred speech and smelt strongly of intoxicating liquor and formed the opinion [redacted] was drunk. On questioning the PIC as to what [redacted] was doing [redacted] going to catch a flight. Officers have explained that [redacted] was too drunk to fly or to enter the airport at that time, PIC asked if [redacted] was under arrest and then proceeded to attempt to get past the officers and telling them to [redacted] arrested for D & D

18 and 19 A/O [redacted] gives the cirs, officers called to [redacted] to report of a [redacted] shouting loud [redacted] when they got there [redacted] whilst trying to speak [redacted] the pic kept shouting out [redacted] eyes glazed and incapable of standing unaid at that time, [redacted] was arrested under airport bylaws, being drunk inside an airport. PIC walked in unaided and not drunk and incapable. Necessary regarding [redacted] behaviour at the airport. They did consider less intrusive an airport
