70.67% of requests have been closed on time since May 2018.

Without going into each individual record West Midlands police cannot be day-specific about whether the Subject Access Request was closed on time. We have been able to produce a report which shows SARs closed within the month they were due, and therefore that is what this percentage is based on. For instance, a request might have been due on 5th May, but was closed on 25th May – the report only shows that it was due in May and was closed in May. This also means that the data is reflective of the whole of May 2018, rather than specifically 25th May as stated in the FOI Request. There are 1361 records, please note that researching each individual case would exceed the appropriate limit (FOIA, s.12).
