We do not have a marker or internal definition for 'rural' crime. All crime is recorded based upon geography within the Force, it is recorded by the Neighbourhood Policing Unit where the crime occurred. While some crimes may happen on a farm, or in a field, there is no way to determine whether that would be classed as rural.
