The issue of Modern Day Slavery is a broad responsibility and sits across Response , Neighbourhood Teams, Force CID, Intelligence and Public Protection. There are strategic and local champions, but this is not a **specific role** and forms part of the officer/police staffs other duties. We have invested heavily in raising awareness of our staff, partners and communities and have arrangements to receive referrals into

the organisation and work with other agencies and charities to provide a holistic response.
