

I am requesting the following information under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act; shift patterns used by the following police officers and members of police staff.

Response Officers – Work a 6 on 4 off shift pattern comprising 2 x Early Duties 2 x Late Duties and 2 x Night Duties followed by 4 x Rest Days

Neighbourhood Officers – Work a 6 on 3 off shift pattern comprising 3 x Early Duties 3 x Late Duties and 3 x Rest Days

Custody Sergeants - Work a 6 on 4 off shift pattern comprising 2 x Early Duties 2 x Late Duties and 2 x Night Duties followed by 4 x Rest Days

Traffic Officers – Work 2 x 12 hour Day Shifts 2 x 12 hour Night shifts and have 4 Rest days

Dog Officers - Work a 6 on 4 off shift pattern comprising 2 x Early Duties 2 x Late Duties and 2 x Night Duties followed by 4 x Rest Days

CID Officers – Work a 6 on 3 off shift pattern comprising 3 x Early Duties 3 x Late Duties and 3 x Rest Days

Control Room/Call Centre Staff – Work a combination of different shift systems dependent on role

A. 6 on 4 off shift pattern comprising 2 x Early Duties 2 x Late Duties and 2 x Night Duties followed by 4 x Rest Days

B. 6 on 3 off shift pattern comprising 3 x Early Duties 3 x Late Duties and 3 x Rest Days

C. 2 x 12 hour Day Shifts 2 x 12 hour Night shifts and have 4 Rest days

Enquiry Office Staff - 6 on 3 off shift pattern comprising 3 x Early Duties 3 x Late Duties and 3 x Rest Days

Detention Officers - Work a 6 on 4 off shift pattern comprising 2 x Early Duties 2 x Late Duties and 2 x Night Duties followed by 4 x Rest Days
