- Chair asked everyone to look at days of the week for IAG meeting update at end of meeting

Presentation by Abdullah Rehman (bahu trust) Abdullah presented videos on the faith inspired approach to domestic violence and – Knife crime and empowering communities. He also mentioned [REDACTED] from the guardian task force who works alongside the bahu trust when needed to connect with youths. [REDACTED] has been coming regularly to the weekly empowering youth project workshops and it is part of his normal policing working hours, agreed by senior management.



The Bahu Trust is coordinating a Youth IAG for Birmingham East.. Members will consist of the youth group involved with the Bahu Trust empowering futures project. Bahu have been liaising with [REDACTED] and the group to set something up early next year. The advisory panel will consist of ages 15 - 19 year olds from Sparkbrook and surrounding areas.

#### Constituency Updates:

**Hall Green:** [REDACTED] has seen a fall in totally recorded crime over 3mth period No guardian offences. [REDACTED] also said we need to find better ways of working with young people. The Hall Green youth empowerment panel is up and running well a visit was arranged with the group last week which also included an input from firearms officers this was extremely well received. Sparkbrook one of the forces impact areas will have the charity get connected working in the area they will deliver a communication plan Jan 2020. New [REDACTED] [REDACTED] has arrived at Sparkhill he will be overseeing an Impact team based at Sparkhill Police Station.

There has also been a full time officer put in place to work in schools alongside a restricted officer.

Over a 3 month period there has been a reduction in total recorded crime of 20%.

- 6.4% Robbery down
- Violence big reduction also seen.

**Hodge Hill:** [REDACTED] Fall in crime in a 2 month period also fall in violent crime

[REDACTED] One nominal also arrested for breaches of injunction. [REDACTED] also commented on under 25 violence and how all are getting a better understanding on intervention plans etc. Mentioned briefly Star city incident and that this is still an on-going investigation. Also updated on the progress of street watch in Hodge Hill.

**Stechford:** [REDACTED] Introduced himself and provided an over view of his years in the service. He also went on to give update on the work which is going on in his constituency. Intervention and prevention on-going work and extremely keen to get more community involvement, he will also be looking at more visible presence around school and working towards a smarter use of resources. Knife Arch operation in schools going well and Kesh (Sheldon) are now starting to slowly open their doors.

Over a 3 month period there has been a reduction in total recorded crime.

- 4% Reduction in BDH
- 14% Violence increase
- 27% Robbery
- Vehicle Crime increase

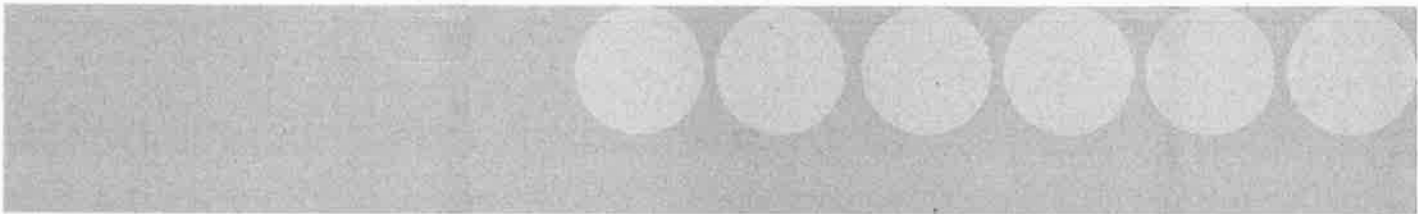
- Chair: There has been lot of firearms seizures, can we have an input on what happens next, i.e. ballistics, investigations what happens to the guns etc.
