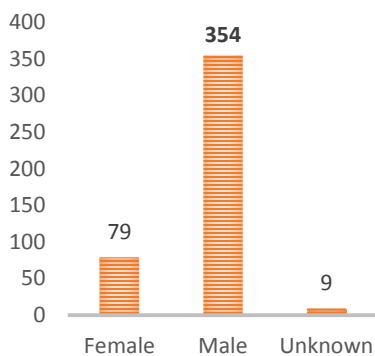
COVID-19 ENFORCEMENT NOTICES – FORCE PROFILE

Up to and including 21/05/2020, ACRO has successfully logged **442** enforcement notices from West Midlands Police, ranking them 11th in England. 220 have been returned to the force for mandatory data to be added or clarified. In respect of the above notices, ACRO have issued **35** letters and received **9** payments.

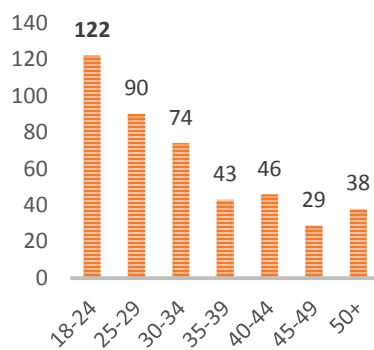

The process for issuing FPNs is one that has evolved at pace, with amendments being made as issues arose, and police forces having to adopt processes at very short notice.

ACRO's initial rejection process did not incorporate all mandatory fields as we now know them and so, as letters are now being issued, it has come to light that some FPN's which had previously been deemed as successfully logged, did not have all mandatory requirements for issuing of the notice letter and so have been rejected at that letter issue stage.
