

Please provide the number of fixed penalty notices issued to drivers from the Average Speed Cameras at these locations and speeds.

- Stafford Road
- Black Country Route

If there have been no fixed penalty notices could you explain why?
Please provide an explanation on average speed is determined.

There are two ways to calculate speed.

1. You can measure the distance from 1 speed camera to another and calculate the speed by using the DISTANCE, SPEED, TIME method.
2. You can measure the speed of the vehicle from each camera and divide by the amount of recorded speeds for an average.

What option do the cameras use?

Please provide yearly data since implementation to the latest records you have.

We are only able to provide what data has been finalised as each Notice of Intended Prosecution has up to 6 months to finalise therefore the data below is only what has already been paid and finalised.

There are 3 resolutions to each of those offences, Fixed penalty, Speed awareness course and court. As these offences are still in progress it would not be a conclusive figure.

So far the below data are what we currently have:

Stafford Road – 10 Fixed penalties paid – 48mph x 2 - 49mph x 3 – 50mph x 1 – 51mph x 1 – 53mph x 2 – 58mph x 1

Black Country Route – 716 fixed penalties paid – 48mph x 120 – 49mph x 106 – 50mph x 70 – 51mph x 55 – 52mph x 35 – 53mph x 28 – 54mph x 77 – 55mph x 62 – 56mph x 43 – 57mph x 34 – 58mph x 21 – 59mph x 14 – 60mph x 19 – 61mph x 9 - 62mph x 4 – 63mph x 4 – 64mph x 4 – 65mph x 11

The average cameras that we have in use are option 1 for the way the speed is measured.
