Mobile vans - Mobile cameras are deployed from the back of an enforcement van, allowing them to be moved around the West Midlands as needed. The mobile camera vans are clearly marked to indicate that they are conducting speed enforcement and operators will place additional temporary signing to warn of the camera and, if necessary, remind drivers of the speed limit, if no fixed signage is present. This signage is not a legal requirement and would not negate any offence should it not be present.
